- 3. **Course Description:** This is an advanced graduate financial mathematics and accounting course introducing credit modeling and expected loss theory and practice. The emphasis will be solution techniques of classical problems in these topic areas as a bridge to further work.
- 4. **Course Prerequisites:** An understanding of multiple linear regression, principles of accounting including allowance accounting, and understanding of financial institutions and banking is recommended but not required.

- Course Objectives: The purpose the course is to ensure students achieve proficiency in credit risk modeling and allowance calculation for financial securities. Further, the successful student will obtain an understanding of the requirements of current regulatory requirements, particularly Current Expectation of Credit Loss (CECL).

Students will understand how to perform vintage analysis; roll rate methods; loss rate methods; probability of default, loss given default, and exposure at default; transition matrix approaches; and discounted cash flow analysis.

Students will further learn to find and examine financial statements of banks and related financial institutions.

 Articulate and demonstrate the effects of allowance changes on banking activity;
