Mexico: Sustainability in Emerging Countries

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

This 3-credit program is focused on sustainability in Oaxaca Mexico. Sustainability is comprised of five different components: increase in production, efficient use of non-renewable resources, ecological stewardship, economic improvement, and increase in quality of life. Oaxaca is classified as one of the top Mexican states in ecological, agricultural, cultural, and culinary diversity. During this program, students will visit several locations in the state including the capital city, small towns and villages, and the pacific coast. Students will learn the differences in culture, ecosystem, agriculture, and economics between the USA and an emerging country such as México by exploring one of the most diverse states.

Students will examine the increase in production and efficient use of non-renewable resources, ecological stewardship, economic improvement, and increases in quality of life in Oaxaca. Students will synthesize and evaluate each of sustainability-based experiences during the travel time using a photo-journal and answering the reflection questions. Students will also demonstrate ability to work collaboratively in group activities; demonstrate ability to communicate with fellow participants and with the individuals in the host country and become informed about local Mexican history as it relates to sustainable issues all while having a good experience.

Exploration - THE TRIP

Oaxaca-Puerto Escondido México



Day 1, Sunday, May 19. Travel to Oaxaca and check in to our restored, historic center hacienda that is now a comfortable bed and breakfast inn, located within easy walking distance of churches, museums, restaurants and markets. Arrive in time for a 7 p.m. welcome dinner prepared especially for the group. (Dinner included)



Day 2, Travel to the Zapotec archeological site of Monte Alban, considered the greatest Mesoamerican civilization by Chicago's Field Museum of Natural History. Meet ceramic artisans whose village made utensils and icons for food preparation and religious ceremonies.



Day 3, Travel to "Hierve el Agua", an ancient Zapotec ceremonial with natural rock formation fed by mineral springs that are super-saturated with calcium carbonate. Then visit the Mezcal Capital of the World, Santiago Matatlan, where agave is grown, harvested and distilled into mezcal. Pack an overnight bag; you'll be sleeping in the traditional Zapotec rug weaving village of Teotitlan del Valle.



Day 4, We will visit the village market, the 17th Century church, and walk to the weaving studio to see how natural dyes are used to dye sheep wool in preparation for weaving tapestry rugs and other products. After lunch, we will go to El Tule on our way back to Oaxaca.



Day 5, We will be in Oaxaca City today to take a guided tour of the Ethnobotanical Gardens to explore the biodiversity of Oaxaca plants used for food, fiber, shelter and folk medicine. After lunch, you will have the afternoon on your own to discover city markets, museums, and local artisan craft galleries.



Day 6, Flight from Oaxaca to Puerto Escondido. After settling in to your beachside hotel, we will meet to go to an endangered baby turtle release program, and then board a launch on Laguna Manialtepec to see one of the few bio-luminscence lagoons in the world.



Day 7, Today is devoted to studying Pacific coast marine life. We will travel to the coastal city of Huatulco to meet an indigenous fisherman licensed by the federal government to harvest the rare caracol purpura (purple snail), used by the village of Pinotepa de Don Luis to dye hand-spun cotton and silk threads.



Day 8, Bananas, mangoes, coconut and pineapple are commercially cultivated in the region. We will visit a tropical fruit farm and production facility so you can see how Mexico grows, harvests and markets produce.



Day 9, You have the option to visit the local Puerto Escondido market where all manner of regional seafood, meats, vegetables and staples are offered for sale, along with a selection of regional clothing. Or, you can spend the day packing and reflecting on all that you did and saw



Day 10, After breakfast, you will transfer to Puerto Escondido airport for connecting flights through Mexico City to North Carolina or elsewhere.
