Course Description: First order finite difference models; derivatives - limits, power rule, graphing, and optimization; exponential and logarithmic functions - growth and decay models; integrals - computation, area, total change; applications in life, management, and social sciences. Credit not allowed for more than one of MA 121, 131, and 141.

Assignments: The assignments for this course will consist of homework on WebAssign, three tests, and a final exam. WebAssign is required for the course, and should be logged into at http://webassign.ncsu.edu

Required Materials: Each student is required to bring **three small and one large blue books** (found at the campus bookstore) to class before the first exam. Blue books with writing on them will not be accepted. Any student who does not bring their blue books before the first test may receive point deductions on that test and every subsequent test until they turn in the blue books.

Textbook: The textbook for this course is Goldstein, Lay, Schneider and Asmar, Calculus and its Applications (11th, 12th, 13th or 14th ed.). There is also a supplementary text available on WebAssign. Students will have access to the supplement once they register for WebAssign.
