Materials/book: The course will be self-contained and the lectures will be recorded. Additional resources will be given on due time during the course.

Textbook (non mandatory): Elementary Linear Algebra with Applications, Ninth Edition by Bernard Kolman and David R. Hill.

Course Description: The course is an elementary introduction to matrix theory and linear algebra. Emphasis is given to topics that will be useful in other disciplines, including systems of equations, Euclidean vector spaces, determinants, eigenvalues and eigenvectors, linear transformations, similarity, and applications such as numerical solutions of equations and computer graphics. Compares with MA 405 Introductory Linear Algebra, more emphasis is placed on methods and calculations.

Learning Objectives/Outcomes: Learn how to solve and apply linear system of equations, using vector-matrix notations.
