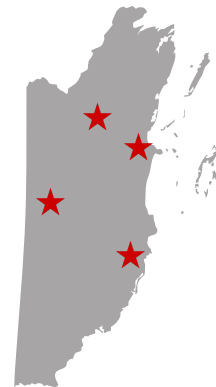


Belize: Culture, Museums, Foodways and Environment
